By fitting the opening with folding or awning-style glass windows, the homeowner can easily pass platters of food, fresh cocktails, and clean dishes directly to guests outside without

constantly walking back and forth through the house. Adding comfortable bar stools to the exterior side of the counter creates an inviting, casual dining spot that keeps the cook engaged with the outdoor party while remaining at their interior prep station.
